Having the group split over two parts of the week has been challenging. We may work on some other music in the meantime. We now have drummers on A days and B days. We are looking at attending the OSSAA Jazz Contest in late April.

Winter Guard rehearsals are underway on Monday and Friday nights. The big challenge right now is funding. We did not get to do very much fundraising last spring or this year. We may look at doing some costume making fundraising. The staff salaries are not covered at this point. We may need to do an ask for more funds from the Booster specifically for the Guard. We may also need to look at a different financial structure for the budget next year. There are several contests planned this year such as Choctaw, Shawnee and Mustang for State. The need is expected to be between \$3500 and \$5000.

At the middle schools, both Cheyenne and Sequoyah have spring concerts on the schedule. We are hopeful and determined to have in-person performances with those students.
